WHEREAS, since 1948, the family business has been in three locations, has had five name changes and four spin-off businesses, and still remains open, with his name above the door to honor his legacy; and

WHEREAS, he married in November, 1952, and was married for more than 50 years until his death in 2005; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, this remarkable man touched many different people's lives and was a very giving and open hearted man who is dearly missed.
