

KNO MOTION REGARDING KIRKWOOD BOUNDARIES 5/10/2016

The Kirkwood Neighbors Organization (KNO) formally opposes any re-drawing of Kirkwood's boundaries, including KNO opposition to reported proposals regarding boundaries to the west and south.

The Kirkwood Neighbors Organization (KNO) finds the historical record is clear regarding Kirkwood's boundaries, both as an incorporated city 1893-1926 and as a distinct City of Atlanta historical neighborhood on the National Historical Register.

The Kirkwood Neighbors Organization (KNO) finds that Kirkwood's neighborhood boundaries are well documented by the below, among many other documents:

1915 City of Kirkwood Map – Woodbine, Montgomery, future Dekalb Memorial Park no changes.

The Kirkwood Neighbors Organization (KNO) finds that Kirkwood's current boundaries originated through successive re-incorporations of the City of Kirkwood by the Georgia legislature c. 1899-1914 that expanded Kirkwood to the west (Montgomery) and south of Memorial (DeKalb Memorial Park).
